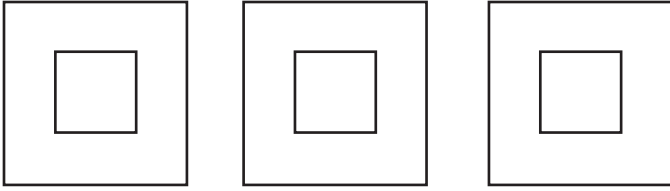


Color Worksheet

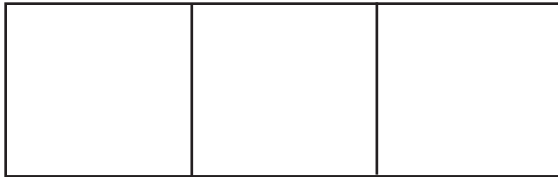
Complementary color:

2. Paint 3 analogous colors in the boxes below. Then, write the definition to the right; indicate where the colors are located on the wheel.



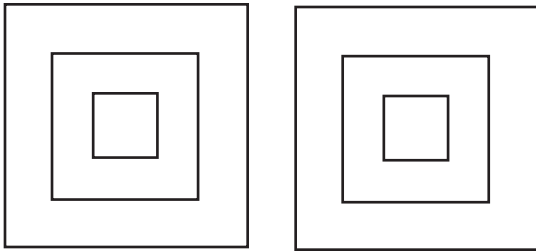
Analogous colors:

5. Paint an achromatic scale. Then, write the definition below.

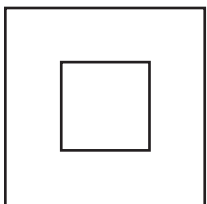

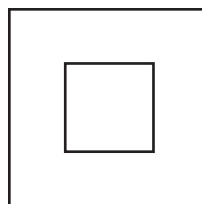
8. Mix a color. Paint it as an opaque color in the exterior box and as a translucent color in the interior box. Then, write the definitions to the right.



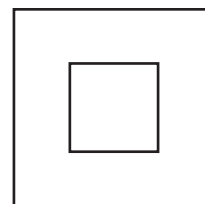
